Prayers of Worship in Heaven Rev. 11, 15, 16

The Book of Revelation (some times known as The Revelation of Jesus Christ), is one of the most interesting in the entire Bible. Much of it is written in a style called "apocalyptic" language. It is a picture language, meaning that the d escriptions and events are figurative in n ature, and as such, very difficult to unde rstand. Most Bible scholars believe the language of the book comes right out of the Old Testament prophets.

It is not our intention here to exegete the book. Suffice it to say that it is a book of victory. The message is: S atan loses, and the Lord and His people win. The prayers in heaven reflect the power, might, glory of God. What Can We Learn? 1. Rev 11

- The kingdom of the world is seen being transformed or transferred to the Lord, and is permanent
- The elders give thanks because of the exercise of God's power in his beginning to reign
- It is as if heaven recognizes and understands the work of God in the affairs of men
- 2. Rev 15
- Read Ex. 15:1-18 to understand the reference to the song of Moses
- The victorious ones celebrate the conquering power of God
- Note the emphasis on the great and marvelous works, the righ teous and true ways, and the unique holiness of God
- All this is possible because His righteous acts (or judgments have been revealed

3. Rev 16

- This is a prayer acknowledging the enemies of God's saints and prophets, and the fact that God had given them in turn what they imposed on God's people
- The voices from the altar praise
 God for avenging them
